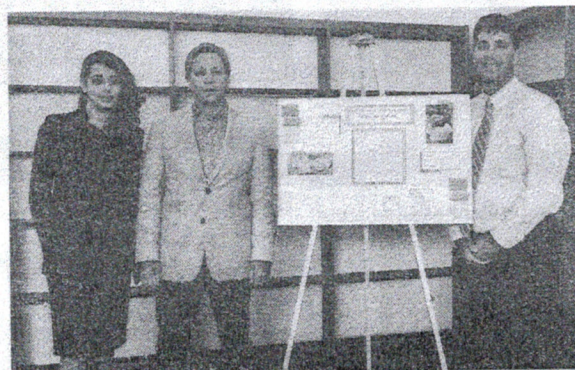
Hancock County Deputy Dezo Polgar gave a presentation entitled "Refuse to be a Victim". He discussed crime prevention and personal safety with the group.

Oak Glen High School is meeting the challenges of the 21st Century learner through public/private teamwork. Thanks to a collaborative effort of Oak Glen faculty and the Chaffin/Luhana Foundation the Chaffin/Luhana Media Center at Oak Glen High School is expected to be operational in time for the 2016/17 school year. All Oak Glen students will have access to the Center which will provide library resources, digital tools and other academic support services in one central location. The new space, which previously housed the school's library, will serve as a gateway to information resources as well as a design studio to spur creativity, communication, collaboration and community.

Dave Smith, Oak Glen's principal, approached Eric Chaffin, partner in the Chaffin-Luhana Law Firm and a 1989 Oak Glen graduate, about assisting with the media center. Chaffin responded by providing the \$25,000 to bring the idea to reality. Smith said that a Multi Media Team was instrumental in making the center a reality: Lissa Dullick, Ted Arneault and
